Hi everyone,

So, today for English please look at last Friday's lesson: Friday 5th June - it is a fun lesson about using the skill of inference to become a reading detective! Remember, <u>inference</u> is when we make a <u>clever guess</u> or <u>prediction</u> about something to do with the story, using evidence from what we have already read plus our common sense, to guide our thinking!

There are two video clips to watch (one to remind you what inference is, and one of the story of *Tiddalik the Frog*) and then three activities:

<u>Activity 1</u>: Look at the inference challenge cards and choose 3. Read the information carefully then answer the questions. Write your answers down and discuss them with your family.

<u>Activity 2</u>: Watch the video all about Tiddalik the frog. Think about the characters, how they are introduced and what you learn about them, then answer the questions. <u>REMEMBER</u>: use evidence from the story to support your answer.

APE your response = answer, prove it, explain it!

Activity 3: The video only told you the start of the story, can you use what you've learned and use your inference skills to write the ending to the story? What is most likely to happen, and why? Write in full sentences, use lots of description and choose interesting vocabulary to make your story fun to read.

Think about:

- What Tiddalik and the other characters are like.
- How Tiddalik will be feeling after drinking all that water.
- Whether you think the other animals will help Tiddalik.
- Whether you think Tiddalik will change by the end of the story.
- Will it be a happy ending?

Write in full sentences, add lots of description and chose interesting vocabulary to make your writing fun to read.

When you have finished, and ONLY when you have finished, watch Part Two of the story. Compare your ending with theirs. Were they similar, or different? Which did you prefer, which did your family prefer, and why?

Make sure you enjoy this task today - it is a chance for you to have fun and really exercise your imagination!
