Hi everyone,

So, today for English please look at yesterday's lesson: Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> June - it is a lesson which focuses on the difference between fiction and non-fiction writing.

- **Fiction is made up.** You need to use your imagination when you are writing it. Types of fiction include plays, stories and poems.
- **Non-fiction** is all about **facts**. You can't just make it up. There are many different types of non-fiction writing, such as newspapers, adverts, brochures, reference books and biographies.

There are two video clips to watch and then four activities.

**Activity 1:** Complete the two online activities, arranging the books according to type and filling in the gaps.

**Activity 2:** Watch the video about Britain in winter then write a paragraph about something you saw in the video as if it were a non-fiction text.

You could write about:

- what animals do in winter
- what people do in winter
- the weather in winter
- anything else you noticed

**Activity 3:** Now write a paragraph about something you saw in the video as if it were in a fiction text.

You could choose to:

- Write a setting description.
- Choose a person or animal and write a character description.
- Write a short story or poem about anything else that you thought was interesting.

**Activity 4:** If you can, show your two paragraphs to someone at home. Can they work out which paragraph is the **fiction** and which is the **non-fiction**? Ask them to explain how they know.
