What a busy half term this has been for Snowdrops! We have worked incredibly hard, and Miss Hawes could not be prouder of us all. The children have settled fantastically into school life, we have embedded the routines and expectations impeccably – Miss Hawes cannot wait for Spring term to see even more progression!

We began our term with Stickman. The children loved this story and immersed themselves into our learning. We went to our outdoor learning area and made our very own stickmen, found him hiding in a tree, recalled the story and wrote some fantastic sentences! What a fabulous half term we have had in Bluebells! We have been working incredibly hard in our learning.

In maths we have been learning to use a number line to support both addition and subtraction problems, learning all things shape and enjoyed the challenges DecemBAR brought us. The children are becoming more independent in their maths learning and are able to use their maths packs without prompts from an adult. The maths packs were created by the children themselves, they each have a folder which lives in their draws, the folder contains the manipulatives they may need to support their learning in maths such as number lines, cubes and hundred squares.

We have worked incredibly hard on our writing this half term and loved reading all about Stickman (we loved it when he brought us snow!). Year one can independently use capital letters, full stops, finger spaces and adjectives to make their writing more exciting.

In Geography this half term, we have been learning about human and physical features and comparing a European and non-European country. The children loved using Google Earth to travel to these destinations!

Alongside all our learning, we took part in the artist of the half term, we looked at Joan Miro.

We loved our art lessons learning about colours, surrealism and who Joan Miro was. We enjoyed showcasing our art to our parents in our art gallery- thank you for coming!

Even with all this amazing learning, we have managed to practice and pull off the most amazing Nativity you ever saw! They deserve an Oscar for their acting, don't you agree?

Year 2 started Autumn 2 with a very exciting trip to the Tower of London! The children loved every minute of the trip from the train ride, to exploring the castle and our firm favourite of meeting a knight- Sir Duncan! We continued to use our knowledge learnt at the Tower of London to continue learning within our unit of Tales, Towers and Turrets! We have ended our unit finishing off with some artwork where we have designed and created our own Bayeux Tapestry in 2D form.

We have been very busy writers this half term! We have created our own poem- If I were in charge of the school which created many laughs for all, including Mrs Flynn! We have learnt about and written our story based on the Christmasaurus by Tom Fletcher. We finished the term with our whole school write based on Kevin the carrot- ours was called A Christmas Carol. The children have really tried hard to ensure all our writing has Capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. We have explored using expanded noun phrases, conjunctions and adverbs in our writing.

In Maths we have been spending a lot of time consolidating adding and subtraction, particularly two, two-digit numbers. Please practise adding and subtracting within 100 over your Christmas break! We have ended our term learning about 2D and 3D shapes, how to count vertices and sides as well as sorting them into groups.

In Science, we finished our unit of the Uses of Everyday Materials by creating a dolls' house out of "junk" and talked about what materials we would actually use to make a real one. We have finished the term getting into the Christmas spirit with Elf bringing us tasks or some Christmas cheer! We have spent a lot of time preparing for our Nativity. We also enjoyed welcoming our adults to create Christmas crafts.

Well done Year 2 for all your hard work this term! We wish you a wonderful break and look forward to welcoming you back in the Spring term.



Rose Class - Mrs Liggins, Mrs Gomm and Mrs Dunning

The second half term of the year has, as always, been busy. We were straight back into the swing of things after the holiday, by designing our own 'Plant-Watering Robot' in English. This led to us writing an explanation text all about what it does and how it works. We then went on to write a story based on the book 'Flood'. This is a beautiful picture book. Our classroom was the scene of our own flood at the beginning (don't worry, it was just pretend) which helped inspire our writing and give us the opportunity to imagine how it may feel being caught up in this situation.

In maths, we continued our work on addition and subtraction, learning how to use the formal column method to add and subtract 3-digit numbers. Currently, we are learning all about multiplication and division. Please make sure you are practicing times tables at home. Times Table Rockstars is a great resource for this. We have been working hard on recalling and repeating our 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables.

In history and geography, we have continued our study of Chesham. We had the chance to look at and handle some artefacts from the Museum of Chesham. We looked at a range of objects that were made in Chesham in the past. Our favourite by far was the Hugmee Bear. In PE, we have been learning how to pass the ball accurately as well as attacking and defending skills in tag rugby. I have been very impressed by their skills this term. We have also started dance, drawing inspiration from machines to perform our movements and dances.

Year 3 have worked extremely hard on learning the recorder. They have learnt the notes A, B, C, D and G to play a range of pieces. The highlight of the half term was being able to perform for our parents and carers in a special music assembly. We were very proud of them and hope that you, and they, enjoyed it.

What a busy term!

In English, we have completed our fourth unit of writing – returning to a narrative; “Bike Boy”. We have written our own versions of the story independently and Miss Daley and Ms Batten have enjoyed reading such titles as “Scooter Girl” and “Roller-skate Boy”! We have also tried to fit in a weekly visit to our newly-refurbished school library – maybe we will see our own stories in a library one day!


In maths time, as well as puzzling over daily DecemBAR questions, we have been following a series of consolidation lessons, to revise and improve our knowledge of basic calculation, place value and number patterns. Miss Daley and Ms Batten hope that the children will spend some of their Christmas break practising their times tables, using Times Table Rockstars (the logins for which have been reissued to all the children in the last couple of weeks).

We are now coming to the end of our Revolutionary Romans history work. The children have created a double page spread in their books to showcase the things that they have remembered from this term’s learning. Next term, our humanities work will be geography-based, looking at natural phenomena such as flooding, earthquakes and volcanoes.

Having completed our States of Matter unit in Science, we have started to explore ‘Sound’. We have conducted a number of investigations to find out what causes sound, including using a drum and some rice, and a bowl of water and a tuning fork, to see the sound wave vibrations in action! We have also started to look at whether sound can travel through different materials. We will conclude the unit in the new year, before turning our attention to ‘Electricity’.

Our Christmas Craft event was a lot of fun. Hopefully, all the children enjoyed the chance to be creative and thank you to those parents who were able to attend.

We wish you all a merry and peaceful Christmas and look forward to seeing you all in January!



Cherry Class - Miss Race and Mrs Weedon

Year 5 have had an incredibly busy half term! We started off the half term with our Year 5 ranger day, which they absolutely loved taking part in with their parents. After being voted the Tidiest Classroom at the end of Autumn Term 1, Mrs Flynn tasked us with helping to tidy up the Quad by doing some litter picking. We did a fantastic job, and it has looked very tidy ever since!

In Maths, we have been covering lots of different topics! At the start of the half term, we consolidated our knowledge of Multiplication and Division from Year 4. We then moved on to starting our Fractions topic. We have been learning all about equivalent fractions, how to add fractions with different denominators and comparing fractions. This month we have also loved taking part in DecemBAR – having a go at lots of bar modelling!

During our history lessons, we have continued our work on the Early Islamic Civilisation. We have learnt about what life would have been like for people living during the Golden Age and the many achievements that occurred during that time. We have finished off our topic by creating a poster all about what we have learnt and consolidating all of our knowledge!

We have enjoyed writing this half term! First, we finished off writing our newspaper report based on a short video clip of Spiderman! We then produced some fantastic narratives, based on the book *The Snowman* by Raymond Briggs (we especially enjoyed watching the film!). Finally, we have written some exciting shape poems about animals – using some interesting metaphors to describe them!

We look forward to starting our new topics in the New Year!

What a busy half term we have had in Year 6! The children have amazed me with their perseverance and maturity in ensuring they learn to the best of their abilities.

In Maths, we have been learning all about fractions. We added, subtracted multiplied and divided fractions and discovered that fractions really aren't all that scary. We then moved onto a short unit on converting measures, learning all about different metric units and how we can use these to solve problems.


In our English lessons, we became detectives and then reporters trying to solve the case of the break-in at the three bears' house. The children wrote some great newspaper articles following our court case deciding whether they felt Goldilocks should be sent to jail for her fairy tale crimes. Following that, we went wintry in our poem The Dreadful Menace. The children wrote some incredible poems using personification and other devices to create imagery for the readers. We also enjoyed writing the story of Kevin the Carrot in his Secret Christmas Mission.

This half term's Science has all been about the heart and circulation. We have learnt about how the heart works and what blood is made of. We also learnt the importance of exercise and water to keep our bodies healthy.

In History, we have completed our 'I have a dream' unit. The children have shown good understanding of the influential people in black history in Britain. Our Art this term has been based on the paintings of a famous black artist – Jean-Michel Basquiat. His artwork started off as graffiti and the children enjoyed recreating pictures in his style.

We rounded off the term with our ukulele concert and the children played really well. They showed how much they had learnt in the ukulele lessons this term and it was so lovely to see so many parents there.

I am so proud of everyone in Year 6 for all their hard work and determination this half term and I wish you all a happy and safe Christmas holidays. Make sure you come back in January ready for lots more hard work!


Annual Trip to the Panto

We have given each child in the school a Christmas Gift – we hope they enjoy these and have a restful break!




SEND/Family Support Monthly Coffee Mornings at Ivingswood

Remember your child needs a coat in school every day as we play out in all weathers and want to use all our outdoor space.

Please also have some additional footwear (old trainers/ wellies) for them to use when they are outside.



As you are aware, attending school every day is important for your child to make good progress in school. This academic year, several families have received fines for taking term time absences.

We monitor attendance and offering support to anyone who fails to meet the expected standard of above 95% attendance. If families fail to engage with us or fail to improve attendance, Buckinghamshire County Council's attendance team will be informed. This could then lead to fines. Lateness counts against attendance marks so all pupils must be present for morning registration. When pupils are late, including those in our nursery class, this has a huge impact on the running of learning sessions for the whole school. All our pupils deserve the best start to each day of learning. We have so much to fit into each school day, our learning starts the moment the children enter the classroom. If you have issues getting your child to Ivingswood Academy for 8.45am each day, please use our breakfast club which is open from 8am or make alternative arrangements so your child can be present on time each day.

If children are unwell during the day, we will contact you if they need to go home, however keeping your child at home because they have a little cough, or they had a late night, a sibling or parent is unwell or it's their birthday are not sufficient reasons to keep them home.
