- 4) In a school of 136 pupils, 49 are absent. How many children are in school?
- 5) My house has 16 windows with 8 panes of glass in each. How many pane of glass are there altogether?
- 6) In three innings a cricketer scored 113, 96 and 102. How many runs did he score altogether?
- 7) John swam 52 lengths in a sponsored swim, Jim swam 39 lengths and Jane swam 42 lengths. How many lengths did they swim between them?
