For example: 4 cm

The perimeter of this rectangle would be 4 + 4cm + 2cm + 2 cm = 12 cm

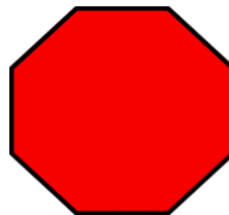
● A square has a side which measures 4cm. What is the perimeter of the square?

Spelling. Use your spelling books to practice these words and then have a spelling test on Friday. If you don't have your spelling book, use the method of look, say, cover, spell, check.

These words are from the spelling list from the National Curriculum that all pupils in Year 3 and 4 should be able to spell and use in their writing.
