
Would you like to live in a house like this one? Give reasons for your thoughts.

Well done if you attempted the tricky perimeter questions yesterday. Here are the answers:

- 1) 8cm + 8cm + 5cm + 5cm = 26cm
- 2) 11cm + 11 cm + 3cm + 3cm = 28cm
- 3) 12 cm + 12 cm + 4 cm + 4 cm = 32 cm
- 4) 19cm + 19cm + 15cm + 15cm = 68 cm

Now here are some shapes to calculate the perimeter. You now some of the lengths of the sides but not all. How do you work them out? Talk about it with an adult first then work it out in your blue book.
