How did you get on with the English and Maths videos yesterday? Those of you I spoke to all managed well, so I will use some of them again another time. I hope you all manage to get some time playing outside or going for a short walk as the weather has been so good.

## Maths

Yesterday your work was based on the part, part, whole method. Today we are using White Rose maths which is familiar to you all as we use these in class together. The difference is you have a video clip to watch first and discuss together before having a go at the worksheet. Please don't worry about not having a printed version. You can use your blue book or other paper you have. Just write the title of the sheet and the question number. Some questions don't need an answer to be written, you can discuss it together. Parents, this work is consolidating that every whole is made up of parts (fractions) that have the same value e.g.  $\frac{1}{4} + \frac{1}{4} = 1$  whole. If you have 10 apples and 1 is green then  $\frac{1}{10}$  is green, the other  $\frac{9}{10}$  are red. You may need to draw some bars to help you child see this concept. Let me know in our phone calls if you need help.
