We are on Summer Term – Week 1 – Lesson 3 – Comparing Fractions.

Parents, we are using $<$ $>$ symbols today. These mean, greater than and less than. The point of the $<$ is always towards the smaller number. Here are some as an example. $12 < 16$. This says 12 is smaller than 16. $190 > 130$. This says 190 is greater than 130. The children are using these symbols with fractions.
