## Maths

I have downloaded the activity sheets and answer sheets for you, so they should be attached to the email you receive, however if that doesn't work you can also download them from our school website, or straight from the White Rose website via the link above.

1. Monday - rounding decimals
2. Tuesday - halves and quarters
3. Wednesday - pounds and pence
4. Thursday - ordering money
5. Friday - surprise challenge!

We are now looking at working with money, something that is really important to learn understanding and managing money is an important life skill! If any of you get pocket money that you can choose to spend on treats at a shop, or if any of you ever help out your adults who might work in a shop, then you should be really good at this sort of thing already!

I have also sent out a support sheet to help you make sure you can recognise the coins and notes properly, and understand the language we use with money.

This is how you convert money from just pence to pounds and pence, and then just pounds using a decimal point:
$500 p=£ 5$ and $0 p=£ 5.00$
$473 p=£ 4$ and $73 p=£ 4.73$
$1503 p=£ 15$ and $3 p=£ 15.03$
$2470 p=£ 24$ and $70 p=£ 24.70$
Remember to check carefully where any place holders need to go, to give the value of tens or ones. Good luck!
