Hi everyone,

So, today for English please look at yesterday's lesson: Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> May - it focuses on subordinating conjunctions. This is where you add extra information to a sentence, giving more detail about where, when or why something happened. The main clause in the sentence gives you the main detail, then a subordinating conjunction is used to give more information about it. If you remember our work on fronted adverbials, these are an example of a subordinating conjunction.

<u>Activity 1</u>: Highlight the subordinating conjunction in each sentence.

<u>Activity 2</u>: Complete the 'subordinating conjunctions jigsaw puzzle' worksheet. You could either print it off, or if you can't do that, just write your completed sentences out in your book.

<u>Activity 3</u>: Copy and complete the 5 sentences, but this time put the subordinating conjunction at the start, like a fronted adverbial.

<u>Activity 4</u>: Finally, write your own two sentences using subordinating conjunctions, placing them at the start of the sentence in the form of a fronted adverbial.

I have downloaded and sent out a support sheet as well, which gives you a range of subordinating conjunctions that you can choose from when completing your tasks today. Good luck. 😊
